CARTER-NEAL

The old Carter cemetery is located on the old Nashville-Murfreesboro Pike and lies between the Walter W. Adams and Forrest Bell properties a little south of LaVergne.

The present Adams home is the old Carter place which was standing during the War Between the States. The Carters are mentioned frequently in the old MARY NEAL KING DIARY which was written between 1862-1864. The diary is the property of Ernest K. Johns, of Smyrna.

During recent years, descendants of the Carter family had the Carter graves moved to Smyrna, Tennessee. The remainder of the graves are here supplied through the courtesy of Mr. Walter Adams of LaVergne.

A LA VERGNE "CITY" CEMETERY FROM OUT OF THE PAST

The cemetery was well hidden, so much so that most of LaVergne didn't know of its existence. Geological maps had it listed as "Cemetery" or "Buchanan Cemetery", and it lay forgotten in the underbrush of time and heavy shrouded green thickets.

The burial ground is located along the Buchanan Springs Branch that winds lazily along the edge of the city park. The old Springs come out from under the bridge.

Most of the few folk who knew of the site knew it as the Buchanan-Ewing Cemetery. Much prior to this, however, it was the city cemetery sometime during the period of 1820 to about the mid-1840's. It once boasted an iron fence enclosure. Only a few of the graves are marked...those of the Buchanan, Pa. Ewing families. Many stone markers are in the cemetery but they are simple rock stones. Any wooden markers would have rotted long ago. There once was a stone that listed the interment or death at 1809 but the stone has not been re-discovered. This was found several years ago when it was quite difficult to investigate all of the site. There are a number of sunken graves contained in the graveyard.

Recently, the LaVergne Arts Council sought the restoration of the nearly two-century old gravesite. It is now part of the LaVergne City Park and Charlie Percy began the tremendous job of clearing the site and giving a bridge across the Buchanan Branch to give access to the cemetery.

The first owner of the land was Samuel Buchanan, the Indian fighter, who sighted the land in 1785 and was deeded the land in 1787. Sam was plowing in his field when he was surprised by Indians and chased. He was surrounded and was killed, this occurred in 1793. Although family records state that he was never married, his inventory at death record showed his wife to be a lady named "Rebecca". Their personal belongings were few, certainly by today's standards, but probably adequate at that point in time. One David Buchanan was administrator and Rebecca subsequently married David. If there were any children of Sam and Rebecca, it is not known. If there were any children of David and Rebecca, that is not known either, but in all probability there were and would account for some of the missing links in the Buchanan family genealogy. The original Sam apparently is not buried there, presumably, and is more than likely buried at the John Buchanan Station graveyard along Mill Creek in Davidson County. The Samuel Buchanan Station was at the LaVergne site and it would be obvious that Sam wouldn't

have come into the Middle Tennessee area for the glory of building his brother John's fortunes. He would have looked out for his own and did. Documentation of the above facts is located in the Rutherford County Historical Publication #6. Sam's death date varied with each of the early Tennessee historians. All of them agreed as to Sam's being killed but agreement was not evident as to when. Sam's activities would keep cropping up in various documents, such as that being a juror in the Davidson County Court, that the various death dates would indicate someone was in error. His inventory of property is on microfilm at the State Library and Archives and lists his death at the year 1793 instead of the other^{er} early historians had given.

The cemetery site area became Buchanansville thought to be due to both Samuel and John Buchanan. Both, according to old deed books, had property in the area. Two of John's daughters married men of early settling families of the community. One was married to a Thomas and one to a Mulherrin. The latter name had a subsequent spelling of "Mullins", or vice versa. The Mullins could have come first and the early Tennessee scribes could have recorded it as "Mulherrin".

The heart of Buchanansville settlement was the "big house on the hill" known to most of us as the Hibbett place. Many years ago there was a family cemetery behind this house and a very few stones were found in recent years. It had been destroyed at some point in time. The stones found, however, had the family names of Burt and Cawthon. The Cawthon family were early Middle Tennessee settlers too, and it is thought that Sam's Rebecca may have been a member of this family. During the 1820's to mid-1840's, the post office was thought to be in this house, as most postal facilities were established in a prominent resident's home. A copy of some letters written to a lday occupant of the home indicated the date of 1843. The letter contents are through the courtesy of Herschel Priestley of Dresden and whose ancestor the lady had been. The family at that time was named Montgomery. A lawyer by the name of Beverly Montgomery had purchased the home and then it was later sold to Joseph Hibbett.

Buchanansville also had an old lane which angled through the present park and the V. H. Mason property. This was an old stage coach route and a portion of the Old Banton's Ferry Pike. It is also part of the land on which the Battle of LaVergne was fought during the War Between the States. The LaVergne battle occurred just prior to and was part of the Battle of Stones River.

Its first Postmaster was John Buchanan who became Postmaster March 8, 1827. John B. Buchanan was born March 10, 1804 and died July 6, 1862. Buried next to this John is L. H. Buchanan born Sept. 12, 1809 and died April 1, 1866. The Buchanan family has

been a large one and each generation seems to boast of Johns and Sams. Documenting the right John and Sam personalities has been no easy task. Each generation would seem to have a John and Sam named among several brothers and each of these men would have sons using the names of John and Sam because the names were progenitor names. There could easily have been a half-dozen or so Johns and Sams in one generation. However, we give claim to this John buried here as Postmaster John; a claim for the city.

The Buchanan family and the Ewing family had marriage connections. Dr. John Ewing's parents are buried there. An obelisk type stone was erected for the family, but the top has been broken. Thus, the reason the cemetery was called the Buchanan-Ewing Cemetery in subsequent years. Documentation for this family's burial records were received by Mrs. Charles Womack of Greenwood, Mississippi. The site is now part of the City Park and effort will be made to establish it as a National Historic Site.

Much work needs doing on the site, although much work has been done by Charlie Percy. Beautification of the area is to be set into motion for the future so that proper preservation can be achieved. It is no longer an old forgotten site. It is part of today's heritage. The restoration is a good example of why we commemorate the LaVergne fore-residents on Old Timers' Day. Without the old timers having lived, having worked toward betterment, and having died believing in their community, our contributions would be more difficult to give. We are fortunate that we had people of vision, character, and strength to have found the time to build and believe. It is remembered here that today also becomes history. We do not have to be rich and famous to be a great person, but it takes greatness to make history. The names of most of us are going to be forgotten like those many unmarked stones in the Buchanan Cemetery, those who gave themselves to life and their homes. The fact remains that they gave. For this we commemorate them...the old timers...and of whom we all shall be at some point in the future.

CASTLEMAN-BRUER

CASTLEMAN-This cemetery is located on the Vernon H. Mason farm which was part of the original Buchanan home in this county. We are now in the process of documenting this site as being the center of "Buchanansville," part of the beginning of LaVergne. The frontier station home is now gone, of course, but it is believed there was a postal station in the Buchanan home during the very early 1800's. A school and church were located across Hurricane Creek on the present property of J. B. McNeil of Davidson County. The land was then in Rutherford County, however, and a large cemetery was located on that property. A few stones can still be read bearing the names of Cawthon and Burt. This cemetery was somehow destroyed several years ago.

HILL-ROULHAC

The old Hill-Roulhac Cemetery is located about three miles south of LaVergne off the Rock Springs-Waldron Road. It faces the original old Butler Lane later referred to as "Gambill Lane." The Butler Lane crossed the Hurricane Creek in the very early 1800's; the present Boyd Paul home is located at the end of the road.

One of the Butler men who was an early settler in the area was married to the sister of Margaret Gray Roulhac of Guilford County, North Carolina. Francois and Margaret Gray Roulhac accompanied the sister to Rutherford County. From Roulhac Memoirs: Dr. Butler promised to give Mrs. Butler 100 acres of land in Rutherford County. The Roulhacs were to accompany her to the "west" and on May 1, 1805, left Windsor, North Carolina. The Roulhacs did not stay in Rutherford Co. at this time but went on to both Roberston and Montgomery Counties then to Lebanon, and finally in 1822, they came to Rutherford County. Francois Roulhac is accredited with the naming of the LaVergne community. Their daughter married into the Hill family who were descendants of Green Hill, land grant holder prior to the forming of Rutherford County in 1804.


